#### On the Go at Km 0!

Drought-like conditions have made it another tough year for the indigenous plants growing at Km 0, but with an ingenious watering system and fills every two weeks by Alpine Water – who carefully back their truck down the trail to fill the totes, our Stewards have managed to keep the trees and shrubs looking pretty healthy. We expect another good watering in the coming weeks so that the plants can be ready for the winter ahead.

The interpretive signage is entering the final stages of approval and once in place, will complete the plaza area which has transformed greatly over the past three years from a barren rail yard to a welcoming and restful gathering place.

#### What's New Along the Trail

In Kelowna, plans are going ahead for a Tier 2 Wayfinding Kiosk at Houghton Road near the bridge to Enterprise Way.

In Lake Country, watch for some improvements coming soon to Trewhitt Point. As well, washrooms are under construction along the Oyama Isthmus.

In RDNO, new bike stations have been installed at Km 0, Westkal, and Kekuli Bay. Seating stones will be placed at appropriate sites along the lake and picnic tables installed. Rock mitigation work has been in progress this month along the cliff section of Kalamalka Lake to keep the trail safe for all.

## Find Your Way Along Okanagan Rail Trail





#### **TIER 1 KIOSK GATEWAYS**

Tier 1 Kiosks are places of information, orientation, and celebration. Gateway Kiosks include banner signage with syilx translation, kilometre markers, info panels, and full trail maps.

#### **TIER 2 KIOSK NODES**

Tier 2 Kiosks serve as start or end points along the Okanagan Rail Trail. Node locations may be dictated by proximity to existing key amenities such as public parking or washrooms. Nodes include all Tier 1 Kiosk information except for the iconic curved banner with syilx translation.





### TIER 3 KIOSK MAJOR ACCESS POINTS

Tier 3 Kiosks are frequently used at entrances and exits onto the trail. Major Access Point Kiosks orient trail users with kilometre markers and mapping. The focus is to help pedestrians and cyclists locate community centres, transportation, or pedestrian routes.
