




FORT Celebrates 5 Years!

Last month marked the five year anniversary for FORT. A lot has been accomplished since FORT became a society in 2019. The Okanagan Rail Trail has made a huge impact on community recreation, encouraging active transportation opportunities and connecting communities. Exceeding Expectations for Trail Usage

Since opening, use along the Okanagan Rail Trail has exceeded expectations by at least 50% even with the north and south sections not yet connected. For some sections, actual use was 2 to 4 times greater than projected, highlighting that our beloved trail is a destination you'll want to return to again and again!



An Iconic Destination Experience in the Okanagan

The Okanagan Rail Trail; known for its beauty and accessibility, is a prime destination for outdoor enthusiasts and families alike. Together with tourism organizations, communities, and recreational groups, we are excited to highlight our loved trail as an iconic destination experience, that provides wide reaching rural and economic benefits.



A Beacon of Environmental Stewardship

FORT has focused on trailside restoration and the planting of native species, fostering a deep connection with nature. With interpretive signage, we are able to share knowledge and promote awareness of plant species and their historical significance. Additionally, by encouraging active transportation, the trail significantly reduces vehicle emissions, contributing to a cleaner and healthier environment for all.



Reconciliation and Indigenous Culture

Collaborating closely with the Okanagan Indian Band (OKIB) has allowed us to incorporate Indigenous names and history along the trail. We have been able to support the installation of interpretive and wayfinding signs developed by the Okanagan Nation Alliance, ensuring their teachings enrich each users trail experience.



Trewhitt Point Complete

There is a new and exciting access to Wood Lake at Trewhitt Point. Last year several FORT Trail Ambassadors came up with the idea of cleaning up this area and with support from District of Lake Country, Central Okanagan Foundation and FORT Fund Development a collaborative effort has created a lovely spot to stop and enjoy the scenery or have a quick dip in the lake. Bike racks, rock benches, and an ONA sign are now installed, with plans for a vertical rock sign at the entrance. Thanks to our Project Management team for their efforts, helping keep this project under budget.
